

#### Our 2025 Goals

In 2025, Yavapai Exploration and Science aims to expand its impact by securing a permanent location to serve as a hub for hands-on STEAM activities. We will broaden our community outreach by partnering with local organizations, and introduce in-building STEAM programs to engage children and families through interactive workshops and classes. These initiatives will help us foster curiosity, innovation, and critical thinking within the community.

#### Establish a Permanent Home for Exploration

Secure funding and finalize the purchase of a dedicated building to serve as YES's permanent location. This space will allow us to expand our outreach, host hands-on STEAM activities, and provide a central hub for our community programs, including workshops, homeschooling support, and after-school initiatives.

#### Expand Community Outreach Programs

Increase the reach of YES by partnering with at least three additional local organizations, schools, or libraries. By building on our successful collaborations with Nature Niños and the Prescott Public Library, we aim to engage more families and children with free or low-cost STEAM activities.

#### Introduce In-Building STEAM Programs

Begin hosting structured, in-building STEAM programs for children and families at our new space. These programs will include interactive workshops, multi-week classes, and themed events that provide handson learning opportunities in science, technology, engineering, art, and math. Our goal is to serve at least 500 participants in the first year.
